


Bradley Pond Trails


Bradley Pond Farm Preserve

In 1991, Frederick and Florence Call donated a conservation easement to the Brunswick-Topsham Land Trust (BTLT), thereby ensuring their spectacular 163-acre traditional farm would remain intact, undeveloped, and accessible to the public. The Calls and BTLT worked together to create a trail system that reveals active hayfields, stone walls, and quiet woods. The trails are named after David P. Boynton, whose tireless work on this and other conservation projects was an inspiration to the entire land trust community.

The Calls have since passed away, but their legacy of continued public access to a lovely, traditional farm property will live on forever. Bradley Pond Farm continues to be used by the current owners for farming and forestry.

Bradley Pond Farm Preserve's forests, marshes, open fields, and views of Bradley Pond offer visitors a quiet rural experience not far from the busy center of Topsham. The property's diverse habitat is home to a wide variety of flora and fauna, and provides an important forested buffer to the Cathance River, which flows into the ecologically significant and unique Merrymeeting Bay.

Please note that this Preserve does not provide access to Bradley Pond or any sections of the Cathance River. Please stay on marked trails to ensure continued public access and be respectful of the landowners who call Bradley Pond Farm home. Enjoy your visit!



DIRECTIONS TO PROPERTY

The preserve is located at the end of Bradley Pond Road. After crossing into Topsham from Brunswick over the Frank Wood Bridge, continue north on Route 201 for 5.5 miles. Turn left on Bradley Pond Road and continue for a half mile. The road becomes dirt and curves to the left at the property entrance. The parking area is on the right before the metal gate. Park only in the designated parking area.

TRAIL USE RESTRICTIONS

- Open dawn to dusk
- No off-road vehicles, bicycles, snowmobiles, or horses
- No dogs
- No fires or camping
- Stay on marked trails and out of hayfields
- No hunting or trapping
- Stay away from residence, farm buildings, and gravel pit
- No water access to Bradley Pond


